My mission is to rehabilitate serious and violent offenders and to make a difference.

My latest rehabilitation experiment gives you the opportunity to experience something from the prisoner's perspective, while at the same time being of great benefit to our inmates.

In my youth I learnt at first hand the value of doing Drama and am only too pleased to allow the prisoners in my care to have the opportunity to express themselves.

For the last four years they have been looking at the lives of famous prisoners from the past and today they are going to recreate some of the most important moments in prison history. Grim they may be, grotesque they certainly are, but I think you will agree that these stories are an inspiration and absolutely uplifting.

If at any time you feel uncomfortable, the warders will be on call to escort you out. Keep your arms in. Do not give reading material to the inmates. No sharp objects. Drinks in plastic cups may be taken into the exhibition. There will be one toilet break for the desperate.

I hope you are enlightened by your visit.








